



# Have you seen it?

*SARGASSUM HORNERI* (= *S. FILICINUM*)




INTERTIDAL PLANTS

First reported from Long Beach Harbor in 2003, this weed, native to Asia, has spread rapidly to Santa Catalina, San Clemente, Santa Cruz and Anacapa islands, as well as along the southern coast of California. It is chiefly subtidal (5-20m), but has been spotted in the low intertidal zone in Orange County.
