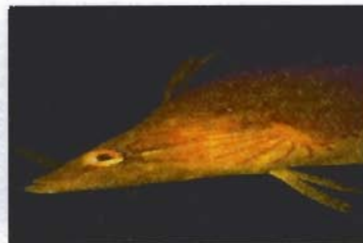

Consensus Comments:

- p. 3 – Because a cave in Oregon has been determined to house the oldest human remains found in North America, the reference to Santa Rosa Island as such should be revised
- p. 5 – California Brown Pelicans are in the process of being de-listed; consider adding other bird species that are threatened and endangered such as Bald Eagles and Xantus's Murrelets
- pp. 5, 7 – 6,980 and 7,000 are both used in the document to present the same information about ship transits. Recommend that one number is used consistently.
- Information indicating that sewage sludge is prohibited should be incorporated in outreach documents
